




The Dominance of the Car



- Urban environment transformed after the 1950's as the car dominates
- Significant changes to the City during the 1960's
- City Engineer, Sir Herbert Manzoni declared that there was little worth preserving and set out to design a city for the motor age
- Large scale segregation of pedestrians and motor vehicles
- Development of urban motorways
- Hierarchy of users


Redevelopment



- Significant policy shift in the 1990's
- Recognition that urban motorways were restricting growth
- Wholistic approach to City Centre regeneration
- Realising land value
- Changes in travel patterns shift to public transport
- Focus on increasing permeability for pedestrians
- Economic, social and environmental objectives
